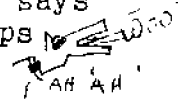
Dr. Double-doom, Did you invent the electric tooth brush ?

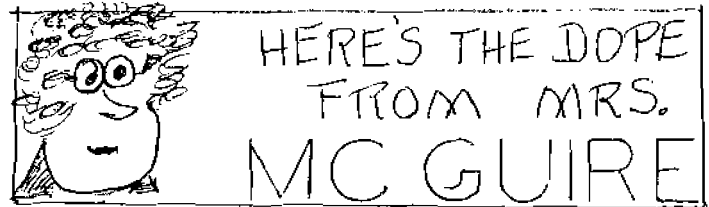
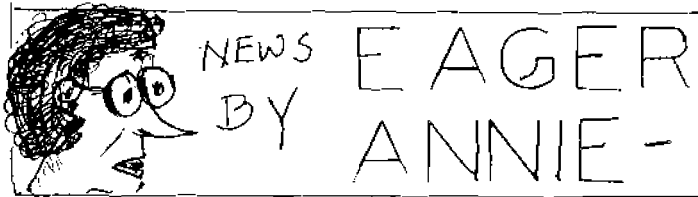

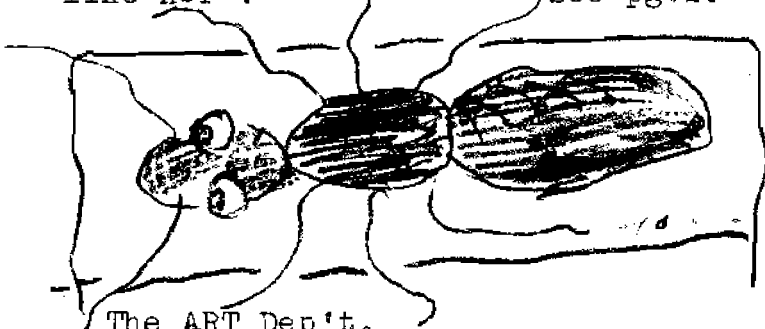
The World's Fair was very good. Unlucky to have been there on the record day... 105,000 people, but in spite of the lines enjoyed it.
